Ann McNeill



Ann McNeill is Owner and President of one of South Florida's few African American female-owned construction companies, and as a licensed General Contractor, Ann is an industry expert devoted to building and moving the nation.

Before Ann decided to strike out on her own and take advantage of the reconstruction opportunities following the McDuffy riots of 1980 in Miami, Florida, she was employed by Miami Dade Transit. In the late 1970s, Ann was the first African-American female Contract Administrator at Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Group, and the only female construction manager of Atlanta-based Thacker Construction's new office in Miami. Not new to the broad thinking of visionary leaders, this industry professional joined Miami-Dade COMTO as one of the original members. Not long after, with the confidence and clarity taught

by experience, Ann launched **MCO Construction & Services, Inc.** Within a short span of time, her construction management contracts began to accrue in excess of \$200 million. Soon Ann and her team of "MCO-ites," which included five cultures, was participating in the \$700 million Miami International Airport South Terminal Project with a team of eight contractors.

Aside from the construction industry, Mrs. McNeill serves as President and Founder of International Mastermind Association, Inc., empowering countless people to have a better quality of life through Napoleon Hill's Mastermind principles. Mrs. McNeill also founded the National Association of Black Women in Construction, an advocacy organization for black women in construction. Ann is a life coach and public speaker. Through her company, Constructively Speaking, Inc., she has delivered countless speeches on diversity and inclusion. She has impacted the lives of people from all walks of life. Most recently Ann is taking the MasterMind concept around the world, with a special focus on work-life balance.

Ann McNeill received her B.S. degree in Accounting from Florida Memorial University and her M.S. in Finance from Barry University. She is still dating and married to her college boyfriend, Daniel McNeill. Together they have raised three successful entrepreneur-business owners - two daughters and one grandson and one grand-daughter, Malachi, and Rajah.
